

Competition 2016 for Chargés de Recherche positions (CR1 and CR2) – Section 07

Note to the candidates.

Note written in Paris during the jury meeting on February 24, 2016

Hearing conditions.

You must show up a proof of your identity in its original version.

You will be given 15 minutes to present your contributions and your research project to the jury. If you cannot speak French you can do your presentation in English. You can also listen to questions in French and answer in French or English.

If you applied to several competitions for Chargés de Recherche positions within Section 07, you will be heard only once by Section 07.

There is a projector in the room. Your presentation must be under the form of a pdf file carried on a USB stick. In NO case you will be allowed to display your presentation from your own computer. Please do not include any video or audio content within your presentation.

After your talk you will have a discussion of about 15 minutes with the jury members.

Advice to the candidates.

The jury suggests you to present:

- your main results, positioned within their scientific context, outlining their originality, interest and relevance;
- your research project, its scientific issues and the methods that you intend to implement for developing it in the labs where your research can take place.

On your USB stick, you may bring any complementary element for updating your application. All the documents should be under the pdf format. For example, those documents might be reports on your thesis (if relevant), updated list of publication, updated version of your integration project, etc.

Reminder.

The hearing of the candidates is decided by the jury d'admissibilité during the plenary meeting dedicated to the analysis of the entire set of applications.

Being present at the hearing is mandatory: any absence, even justified, results in the elimination of the candidate.

The jury d'admissibilité, or sections of the jury, proceed to the hearing of the candidates. The jury d'admissibilité defines the ranked list of admissible candidates for each competition. Then the jury d'admission defines the list of laureates, based on the list of admissible candidates. The lab where the laureate is appointed is decided by the CNRS Institute after the end of the competition.
